HCCDC was proud to celebrate its 20th Anniversary in its current location on Feb. 14th - Valentines Day. The center originally opened in 1978 in the basement of the First Presbyterian Church.

Miss Pat joined the team in June of 1988. There were 29 children at that time.

In 2005 the new facility opened on Church Street. Miss Pat planned to stay 2 years at the new location helping to get things settled, but she is still here 20 years later and is the guiding force!

Our current enrollment is 75 as of April '25, which includes two new classrooms at the Church of Incarnation. We employ 25 people between both centers with a total of 8 classrooms.
